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## Program Summary

## Position Summary

We are looking for a friendly volunteer to provide assistance and time to support a male youth who has autism and is non- verbal.

## Core Responsibilities

- Develop and maintain a supportive, friendly relationship with the individual
- Assist the youth, who is with learning how to use his new computer communication app
- Assist with life skills such as cooking
- Keep regular contact with supervisor to discuss progress

## Qualifications

- Experience or eagerness to support individuals who have autism with communication and engagement in their community
- Computer literacy/technology skills
- Strong communication skills
- Interest in building a relationship based on the person's strengths, abilities and gifts
- Reliable
- Non-judgmental
- Patient
- Ability to maintain clear boundaries
- Demonstrated ability to maintain confidentiality
- Respectful of individual's right for self-determination
- An ability to speak Vietnamese or Cantonese is an asset but not required, as the youth understands English

## Time commitment

- Saturday or Sunday, day and time of day to be mutually agreed upon by volunteer and client

- Minimum of one visit per month, 4 to 7 hours depending on the volunteer's availability. Frequency of visits will be confirmed at the outset of the placement.
- We request a minimum commitment of 6 months

## Location

Activities will take place in the client's home or in the community in the Jane and Finch area

## Training

- General to Family Service Toronto will be provided by Volunteer Resources
- Specific to role will be provided by the Options Community Resource Facilitator
