Family Service Toronto (FST) helps people face a wide variety of life challenges. For over 100 years, we have worked with individuals and families destabilized by precarious mental health and/or socioeconomic circumstances, to achieve greater resilience and stability in more just and supportive communities. We achieve this through our direct service work of intervention and prevention which includes counselling, peer support and education; knowledge building; and system-level work including social action, advocacy, community building and working with partners to strengthen the sector.

FST's PAR groups for men provide a confidential, supportive and challenging environment in which men can take responsibility for, and develop the skills and attitudes to stop their abusive behaviour towards their female partners. PAR clients are referred to FST from the criminal courts. Given the over-representation of marginalized men in the criminal justice system, our PAR clients are primarily marginalized men. Services are provided in English, French, Farsi and Tamil. Groups are co-led by a male-female team.

We are seeking applicants for two different positions:

1. Permanent part-time

English speaking male co-facilitator able to work on Saturdays at the Victoria Park Hub (1527 Victoria park) year round

2. Relief workers to work on a scheduled or unscheduled basis

a) Farsi speaking male relief staff able to work on Thursday evenings, between 5:00 and 9:00 p.m. at the Bathurst-Finch hub (540 Finch Ave. West) in the fall and spring of each year

- b) Tamil speaking male and female relief staff able to work on Tuesday evenings, between 5:00-8:30, at the Victoria Park hub (1527 Victoria Park) in the fall and spring of each year.
- c) English speaking male relief staff who are able to work at 128A Sterling Road on Monday morning between 9:00-12:30 and/or Monday evening between 5:30-9:00 and/or Thursday evening between 5:30-9:00
- d) English speaking male relief staff who are able to work at the Victoria Park Hub (1527 Victoria Park) on Saturdays between 9:00 and 12:30 on a year round basis.

These positions report to the Administrative Manager and the Director, Changing Lives and Family Violence programs in the Next Steps program. We are committed to developing a staff team that reflects the clients we serve.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assist with sign-in, payment collection, attendance and sign-out for participants
- Assist in preparation and facilitation of groups, either open or closed
- May assist in the completion of court reports and/or group activity notes on a timely basis
- May provide crisis intervention counselling when necessary to clients and makes referrals for other FST and community services

QUALIFICATIONS

- MSW or equivalent combination of education and experience over a minimum three-year period (foreign credentials and relevant experience will be considered)
- Minimum of 3 years of demonstrated experience in working with male abusers through psycho-educational group work using an anti-oppression framework
- Proven experience motivating non-compliant clients
- Previous experience in working with marginalized communities and knowledge of cross-cultural issues as related to partner abuse
- Solid understanding of mental illness and addiction, as it relates to partner violence
- Good communication skills in English, Tamil and Farsi (listening, written and verbal)
- Demonstrated ability in working as a member of a team
- Demonstrated commitment to principles of social justice, and challenging all forms of oppression
- Experience supervising students and volunteers is an asset
- Satisfactory Criminal Reference Check/Vulnerable Sector Search executed within the last 12 months
