WHAT IS PAT'S PLACE?

Pat's Place is a temporary safe haven for older people experiencing abuse. At Pat's Place we offer a welcoming environment where residents can take time out from their current situation.

Pat's Place is not a shelter but an apartment at a secure, confidential location in Toronto. A resident can stay up to 60 days rent-free.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Pat's Place is open to anyone, 60 years or older, who is experiencing abuse. People moving to Pat's Place must be able to take care of themselves. If a person requires some support we will work with them to determine how we can help.

Although the building is fully accessible, the apartment is not wheelchair-adapted and some people with mobility challenges might have difficulties.

WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT?

A counsellor from the Seniors and Caregivers Support Services unit will work with a resident.

Services may include:

- Counselling and crisis intervention
- Safety planning
- Referral to/liaison with community services
- Assistance with housing application
- Planning for a future after Pat's Place

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

There is no charge for rent but residents cover their day-to-day costs (i.e. food, clothing, medications, laundry).
