<p>Description of Program and Placement Opportunity:</p> <p>The placement is in the Research, Evaluation and Planning (REP) department, which works with a variety of departments and programs evaluate program impacts and process. The department also takes a lead role in research initiatives and operational activities such as organizational planning and compiling of statistics.</p> <p>The student will be involved in a number of program evaluation projects. This can involve collaborating with teams to develop outcome measures, design an evaluation plan, collect data, analyze data, and disseminate the findings through reports and presentations. There is also an opportunity to be engaged in research and operational tasks.
