Program Summary:

The Options Program at Family Service Toronto is dedicated to creating welcoming, inclusive communities where everyone can contribute their skills and talents. Options works city-wide, supporting individuals and families, adults and children, couples and communities. The Program's focus on equity and inclusion is guided by a person-directed approach and puts us wherever individuals and families need us.

Volunteer Position Summary:

Volunteers for this position will support a youth (12-18 years) who has limited or no verbal skills and uses augmentative communication to gain independence and autonomy by helping them develop and enhance their life skills.

Core responsibilities:

- Assist a youth who has a developmental disability and/or autism with life skills, such as cooking, learning how to use computer communication apps, and community networking and participation
- Develop and maintain a supportive, friendly relationship with the youth to decrease isolation and enhance inclusion in the community
- Keep regular contact with supervisor to discuss progress

Qualifications:

- Experience or eagerness to support a youth who has a developmental disability and/or autism with communication and engagement in their community
- Strong communication skills
- Interest in building a relationship based on the person's strengths, abilities and gifts
- Respectful of individual's right for self-determination
- Ability to maintain clear boundaries
- Reliable
- Non-judgmental
- Patient
- Demonstrated ability to maintain confidentiality
- Computer literacy/technology skills are an asset but not required



Time commitment:

- Two 2-3 hour visits per month
- Day and time of day to be mutually agreed upon by volunteer and client
- We request a minimum commitment of 6 months

Location:

- Activities will take place in the client's home or in the community in Toronto

Orientation and Training:

- General orientation to Family Service Toronto will be provided by Volunteer Resources
- Training specific to role will be provided by the client's Community Resource Facilitator

Benefits:

- Opportunity to gain experience working within the Developmental Disability Sector
- Personal satisfaction received in assisting an individual with an intellectual disability
- References may be provided upon successful completion of the volunteer commitment
